Chairman's Report 2012

It has certainly been an exciting year. Our past Chairman, Geoff Pickles chose not to stand for Chairman this year after 8 years doing the top job. This was a trying period when the Club was negotiating the deal with the Child Care Centre and trying to maintain its existence. **Thank you, Geoff.**

The current board, with me as Chairman, took over in November 2011 However, this report covers from July 2011 to June 30 2012

The year started really badly with the snooker room being flooded. Fortunately this was covered by insurance.

One of the real pleasures this year was naming the No 1 green, "Dom Lopez AOM Green". A great club man and local entity. We'll miss you Dommie! Thanks to our ladies again who provided a wonderful spread.

Some excellent building and facilities upgrade work was completed in the first half of the year. In particular the Men's locker room was upgraded to a very high standard by Mal Gale's company. It was much needed. In addition the functions room was upgraded to a very good standard. This is now utilised by the Bridge Club, exercise and dance classes. It has also proved a popular venue for local people to use as a venue for birthday, engagement and other functions. Part of this work was covered by utilisation of the Sports Foundation Fund.

There was a fair amount of problems with our annual accounts and report. The bottom line was that there were no audited results available for the AGM. The Finance Committee worked with the auditor in having the audit completed and the audited results were eventually passed at a GM on March 31 2012. We were eventually fined by ASIC for late reporting.

There has been limited capital spend (only when necessary) under the new board. A building inspection was completed in the latter part of the year which will allow us to put priorities on work in 2012/13. Major work expected will be damaged roof tile replacement, downpipes and guttering and subject to capital availability, woodwork around the exterior. It is essential that we keep our clubhouse in good order.

Business generally is marginally down on last year. For a club that utilises its outdoor facilities to attract customers, it is not a surprise, when it is considered that we have had one of the wettest years in recent times. As a consequence of this we have instituted a marketing committee under the leadership of Peter Read. In the new financial year you will hear more from this group. My expectations are for more playing members joining and more social groups using the club.

Our finance is under control. Reports are available now within 20 days of month end allowing the board to make practical and informed financial decisions. See the Treasurer's report for more info.

The weather as well as the lack of new playing members has impacted playing numbers on social days. In spite of that our No 5 Pennants team has done extremely well in qualifying for the State Finals at Bomaderry. Good luck and good playing Lads. Our Diggers committee has kindly provided a generous subsidy to the players for travel and accommodation.

Déjà Vu – June 11 2012 brought massive flooding of the cellar part of the club house. As we go to press we are currently working to sort this out. Most of the damage is covered by insurance.

The Club is in good stead financially.

I shall be standing for Chairman again in 2012/2013. There are still many challenges ahead.

TREASURER'S REPORT 2012

The club was running at a loss when the present Board assumed office towards the end of November.

The new Board adopted strict accounting procedures including controls over stocktaking and counting poker machine takings. Major capital expenditure was restricted to essential repairs and maintenance. Reduced patronage in the club resulted in lower revenue from bar trading, poker machines and social functions. While total revenue was down a reduction in overall expenses led to a profit of \$62,227 compared with \$42,608 for the previous year.

But for the rental income from the child minding centre a heavy loss would have been recorded. The Board plans to make more profitable use of club house facilities to reduce the dependence on rental income.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE 2012 FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

WARRINGAH BOWLING CLUB LIMITED is a company limited by guarantee, incorporated and domiciled in Australia.

Reporting Basis and Conventions.

The directors have prepared the financial statements on the basis that the company is a non-reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements. The financial statements are therefore special purpose financial statements that have been prepared in order to meet the requirements of the Corporations Act 2001.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the mandatory Australian Accounting Standards applicable to entities reporting under the Corporations Act 2001 and significant accounting policies disclosed below, which the directors have determined are appropriate to meet the needs of members. Such accounting policies are consistant with the previous period unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs, unless otherwise stated in the notes. The material accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the statements are as follows:

a) Property, Plant and Equipment

Property

Freehold land and buildings are shown at their fair value based on periodic, but at least triennial, valuations by external independent valuers, less subsequent depreciation for buildings.

Plant and Equipment

Plant and equipment are measured at cost and are depreciated (using the straight line method) over their useful lives to the company.

b) <u>Inventories</u>

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

c) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the company's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

c) Goods and Services Tax

Revenues, Expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.
